W Police:

- Ongoing parking issues at the Glen with police and SC enforcement officers in attendance.
- Two males found in possession of cannabis at The Square, Killlearn and one male found in possession of cannabis at the Devil's Pulpit. All issued with Recorded Police Warnings.
- Road traffic collision near to Devil's Pulpit when vehicle overturned. No injury sustained but the road was closed as vehicles blocked carriageway.
- Driver caught speeding at 73 mph on Station Road and reported to Procurator Fiscal.
- Further report of theft by shoplifting at Killlearn Co-op. It is thought to have been carried out by the same person as previous and enquiries are ongoing.

W Planning:

- Development of Former Killlearn Hotel – permission for the demolition of the hotel has now been granted and it is hoped that works will start by the end of the month. The developers hope to start building in August
- Former Killlearn Hospital Site – Section 75 is almost complete. It is hoped building will start at the end of the year.

Roads:

- The new 20 mph scheme for Killlearn is due to be implemented by the end of May. New road signs will be erected in the relevant areas of the village.
- A local farmer has approached SC requesting a 40 mph buffer zone for 600m south of the 30 mph boundary on A875 where there are two entrances to farms
- Susan McDougall, SC Transport Planning Officer and a colleague from the Roads' Dept. will attend the KCC meeting in June to provide more information on local roads' matters i.e. 20 mph works, options for a pedestrian crossing and the forthcoming Killlearn Gateway Project
- Works are continuing at the bridge at Boquhan Burn near Branshoggie on the B818 – this and other urgent works issues with local bridges are being raised by KCC and local councillors

Any other business:



- The Killlearn Heritage Trail was opened by pupils from Killlearn Primary School on Thursday 20th May and the launch weekend on 22nd & 23rd May was well supported by local residents – see website for more details <https://www.killlearnheritage.org.uk>
- Thanks to Loch Lomond Fisheries Trust who are continuing their work on control of Giant Hogweed along the banks of River Endrick and Blane Water
- There has been continuing dialogue with BT with reference to the phone box on Main St. at Well Green. BT is still considering use of the phone box and therefore there is no option at the present time for adoption by the community
- Police have been called recently to deal with fires started by young people gathering in Station Woods. We are all asked to respect our woodland areas.
