<u>Theft</u>

## PLANNING AND LOCAL PLACE PLAN

- Working with Stirling Council Sharon Marklow from Stirling Council's Planning & Building Standards team will be joining the KCC meeting on 15<sup>th</sup> Jan. to listen to planning queries and provide support as applicable.
- KCC is aware of the challenge to Stirling Council being promoted independently of KCC by Graeme Knox in the form of a petition. KCC is already committed to a collaborative approach with Stirling Council's Planning Department and is working with planning officers to listen to their views and to better understand how to effectively represent the wider community viewpoints and factors important to rural life in Killearn.

## 2 New Applications

- 24/00738/FUL 20 Balfron Road, Killearn G63 9NJ (Jackson's Vets) Alterations to dwelling to reconfigure layout, alter window to install patio doors and construct decking area to the rear (no change of use applied for)
- 24/00761/NAG Land At Drumore Wood, Gartness Road Killearn <u>Application for Prior</u> <u>Notification and Prior Approval -</u> Formation of new forestry access – this application replaces the previous application 24/00655/FUL – this application – discussed previously – has now been withdrawn. Further details to be clarified with reference to the timelines of this application and next steps.

#### Works at 41 Station Road (Garden Grounds)

A site visit was conducted by the Stirling Council Assistant Planning Enforcement Officer Tony Stickings on 14/11/24 where the developer, who was on site at the time, was challenged regarding his non-compliance with the prior to commencement conditions and deviation of approved plans of planning permission 23/00719/FUL.

Stirling Council have been informed that no further development shall take place on site until February/March 2025 – in the meantime – the Council is being asked to respond to some specific queries relating to the works ..

- Receipt of the Notification of Initiation of Development and detailed tree protection plan (as per planning conditions)
- The boundary fence between 2 Oaks and the new build has been erected 1.6 metres within the new build land and the new driveway opening appears to be 2.5 metres closer to 43 Station Rd. than shown on drawings.
- The Construction Exclusion Zone is not being applied ...

## ROADS AND GENERAL MAINTENANCE REPORT

#### • Blane Smiddy Bridge

The temporary traffic lights were originally installed at this location as an emergency response to the structural condition of the South East retaining wall. Stirling Council has advised that once works are fully completed, the bridge will be returned to the original give way prioritisation system. Stirling Council have engaged with their road safety colleagues regarding this site and have been advised that this section of roadway does not comply with the criteria for commissioning and completion of a road safety

- Road Closure B818, Fintry Carron Valley) From its junction with Polmaise Road to its junction with the C41 from 0900 hours until 1800 hours from 13-1-25 until 19-1-25 to facilitate resurfacing works.
- **Road Closure A811** from its junction with the A81 to its junction with the A875 from 0900 hours until 1600 hours from 20-1-25 until 24-1-25 to facilitate culvert replacement works.
- Footpath on Station Road Work is progressing on the footpath
